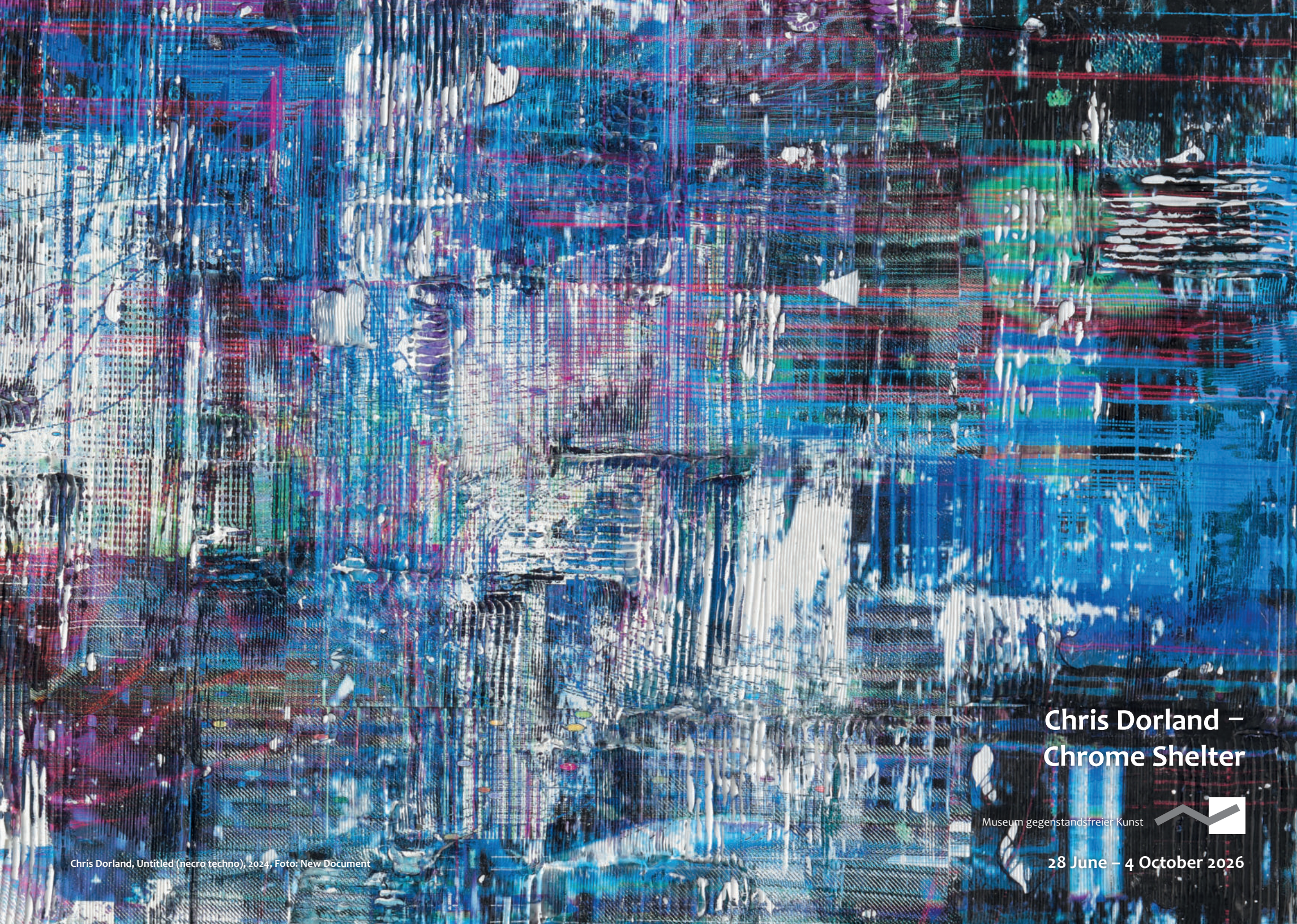

Chris Dorland – Chrome Shelter

Chrome Shelter is the first institutional solo exhibition in Europe by the American-Canadian artist Chris Dorland, presented by the Museum gegenstandsfreier Kunst.

Dorland (born 1978 in Montreal, Canada; lives and works in New York, USA) is considered one of the leading international voices at the intersection of painting and digital image production. His works are represented in collections including the Whitney Museum of American Art and have been exhibited internationally.

Drawing on digital processes such as scanning, image compression, and algorithmic distortions, Dorland develops hybrid image surfaces in which painterly gestures, industrial materials, and digital artifacts overlap. His works address the ambivalence of technological systems: between progress and decay, images emerge that simultaneously structure and destabilize perception.

The exhibition brings together works from Alumacores and Screenscapes, alongside a newly developed video work. An immersive exhibition environment featuring architectural structures, reflective surfaces, and a large-scale LED screen expands the presentation into a spatial experience. The exhibition space itself becomes part of the artistic work and can be experienced as a dynamic constellation of surface, light, and reflection.

The title Chrome Shelter describes a structure that is simultaneously protective and filtering: a surface that promises stability while fragmentation and disruption remain visible. In this way, the works continue the tradition of non-objective painting through the visual logic of contemporary digital systems. Dorland's works usher abstract painting into the digital present.
